WWW Sites (World Wide Web)

Last name, First Name. "Title of article in quotes." Title of complete site if applicable, underlined. The document date, if known and if different from the date accessed. The full http address. (And the date of visiting the page in parentheses)

e.g.

Burka, Lauren. "A Hypertext History." Cyber Dimension. Dec. 1997.
<http://www.cybermill.org/pub/essay.htm> (5 Apr. 1998)

Synchronous Communication (MOOs, MUDs, IRC, Chat etc.)

The name of the speaker(s). The type of communication (i.e. Personal Interview), the address if applicable and the date in parentheses.

Brown, John and Mary Smith. Personal Interview. IRC (12, Apr. 1998)

E-Mail, Listserv and News list Citations

Author's name (if known). "The subject line from the posting in quotation marks."

The date of the message if different from the date accessed. The address of the listserv or news list, along with the date of access in parentheses. For personal e-mail listings, omit the e-mail address.
